
This week, we have been learning to read and spell words ending in **le** saying /l/.



The /l/ Sound Family

le is sometimes used when the /l/ le sound is at the end of words that have more than one syllable and where it follows a consonant. le is used more often than el.

> giggle apple



If the **le** word has a short vowel sound, the consonant before the le is doubled, e.g. giggle.

If the **le** word has a long vowel sound, then the consonant before the le is single, e.g. table.

This spelling is often used at the beginning or in the middle of words. It is sometimes used at the end of words after some vowel digraphs. ook sleep

cool

This spelling is used at the end of one-syllable words with a short ll vowel sound. It is sometimes used in the middle of longer words and also in compound words.
