## Sports Premium Funding

The purpose of Sports Premium funding is to improve the quality and breadth of PE school sport and increase participation in both. At Stoke Prior school we have recently committed a significant amount of funding in this area. We have also accessed support from the secondary school specialist sports teacher who has been funded via the Secondary school up until recently.

Our sports premium funding will total around £17000, it been committed in the following ways.

- We have employed a sports specialist coach to deliver high quality sports and fitness lessons inside and outside of curriculum time. Meaning that smaller groups can be taught enhancing the experience. (approximately £14000)
- Remaining monies will be used to help pay for transport to and from Hereford Games and other festivals and events and for this year to help purchase high quality PE and sports equipment for the school.

## Impact Assessment

## NOTE Stoke Prior School has 88 pupils.

- In June 2015 Stoke Prior School achieved a Silver Award. School Games Mark. and in 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2019 achieved a Gold Award. The award was suspended in 2020 and 21 due to Covid 19. However we would have been applying for platinum award.
- Stoke Prior school regularly produces competitive teams that often win local cluster tournaments.
- Stoke Prior school has won county wide tournaments in Kwik Cricket and Tag rugby and football over the last 12 months.
- Stoke Prior School has a reputation for excellent commitment to whole school sport. At the summer games 50% of KS2 children took part either competitively or in fun tournaments.
- We operate a regular fixture list in Football, Netball and Tag Rugby. We attend Cluster and county tournaments in Cricket, Rounders, Tag Rugby, Football and Hockey.
- We maintain links with Hereford Cricket and Luctonians Rugby club. They supply coaches. We also have links with local Tennis Coaching staff who run PE sessions and after school clubs.
- Our school enters teams of up to 30 children in local cross country competitions.
- Sport has an extremely high profile in school life.

• Participation and experience of sporting festivals and tournaments for the whole school is promoted through Cluster access to KS1 festivals and in school owl tournaments and sports days.

The governors review this statement annually

NB: The Year 5 and Year 6 cohort did not access their final 10 weeks of swimming lesson in Summer 2020 due to facilities being closed for Coronavirus. The following information is based on 2021 assessment when the children were in Year 6 but had missed one year of swimming.

Meeting national curriculum requirements for swimming and water safety.

What percentage of our 2020 Year 6 cohort use a range of strokes effectively [for example, front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke]?	79%
