# **Background information**

Herefordshire Council, as the Local Authority responsible for education provision, has a statutory responsibility to secure, as far as is reasonably possible, early years education provision that is of good quality, accessible, flexible, inclusive and provided through a range of settings to meet parental demand for childcare for children aged two, three and four. All three and four year olds are eligible for 15 hours of childcare per week regardless of income or employment status. Eligible working families can receive an additional 15 hours of free childcare, bringing the total to 30 hours per week.

It has been identified that there is a need for further Pre-School places in areas surrounding our geographical location.

### The Proposal

The school Governing Body (Trustees) feels that the time is right to consider the incorporation of the provision for three-year-old (3+ pre-school) children into the school alongside our current provision for Reception children.

This school based nursery provision will operate within our school building and we plan to adapt our current Early Years Classroom and other facilities to meet the needs of our younger children. The government recognise that Quality school-based nursery provision is popular with parents, especially families with multiple children. It can mean a single point of contact, easier drop-offs and pick-ups and continuity of care from the beginning of a child's education.

It can also provide parents with flexibility around pick up times if parents have multiple children at one school.

We would hope that if this change is approved we would implement it by January 2026. We also recognise that the pre-school will likely grow over each year that it is used. As children turn 3 they will start so numbers in the Autumn Term, Spring Term and Summer term is likely to increase.

#### **Evidence of Demand**

Over recent years a number of children who are within the catchment of Stoke Prior School have gone on to attend other primary schools because there was no pre-school provision within the catchment area. In a recent questionnaire a number of families from within our community stated that they would attend a pre-school if one was provided at Stoke Prior. The school has started a Friday morning Playgroup (Little Owls) and many parents have expressed an interest in a local pre-school. Local Authority information says that while the school is not directly in an area of need it borders areas of need for additional places. Recent increases in government funding has led to higher demand for nursery places.

#### **Accommodation Required**

The school has calculated that it could accommodate up to 11 Pre-School children if we were at our Full PAN of 11 in our Reception class. The classroom space can accommodate this and some changes to our toileting facilities are planned to take place in advance of starting the provision. It may be that in future years we would accept more or less children in our Pre-School subject to a maximum of 22 children in this class. Our Pupil Admission number (PAN) for Reception class therefore will not be affected. Our Reception class PAN is 11 If the school accepts over PAN the number of pre-school children it could accept will reduce, but if less children are in Reception than 11 the school would need to guarantee that we could provide places for 11 children in Reception

year. Therefore the accommodation of additional Pre-School places should not be allowed to prevent the school from accommodating 11 Reception children allowing for in year transfers.

#### How the decision will be made

At the conclusion of this consultation period the Governors and trustees of Three Counties Academy Trust will consider any issues that have been raised before deciding whether to make a significant change application to the regional office.

#### **Consultation Phase**

The Governors / Trustees will take note of issues raised during the consultation. At the conclusion of the consultation period a decision will be made whether to submit a formal proposal to the regional office.

#### **Implementation**

If approved, this proposal will be implemented by the school from 1st January 2026
