Dear Parent

I hope that this letter finds you and your families well. I can't believe that we are already approaching half term. It has been a very busy and productive half term.

As seems to be the case in other schools nationally, there have been several positive cases of Covid within our school community this half term. We have therefore responded with re-instating some measures which have included staff wearing face coverings in corridors and limiting contacts in assemblies, breaks and lunch. I appreciate your support in managing this situation and would once again encourage you to be alert to the symptoms (see newsletter) and to get a PCR test if your child or other household member experiences them. The Lateral Flow tests were designed to identify asymptomatic cases and are therefore not as reliable as the PCR test in picking up positive cases. It is so important that we continue to prioritise keeping everyone safe.

I wanted to express my gratitude to the families who attended Mrs Kelly's retirement Mass. It was a lovely evening and was such a great opportunity to properly thank her for all that she has done for the children and community of St Peter's.

I hope that you have found the Parent Consultation meetings useful this week and that this has been a good opportunity to meet with your child's class teacher to discuss how they have settled in and the progress that they are making.

Thank you to our School Council for their work this term, in leading the school on our Harvest collection. Please remember to bring a food item this Friday so that they can distributed locally.

It was a lovely day last Friday, when the children celebrated 'Forest School's Day' in their woodland colours. All the classes enjoyed activities in Squirrel Wood. The money raised will be used towards funding steps towards us becoming a Forest School. Thank you to the PTFA for their commitment to supporting with this. Katy is working very hard through the course and enhancing her expertise.

It is fitting that during the Season of Creation we think about the role we have as stewards of God's creation. As world leaders meet for the COP26, it is a good time to reflect on the issues that face our environment and how we can all play a positive role. Led by Year 6 we are looking to be inspired by good role models. Next half term we will be choosing new saints for our House teams that represent this ambition.




Harvest Own Clothes Day FRI 15 OCT
