# **Nursery News**

This half term we have been busy looking at the world around us. We have visited lots of places in the school including the library, the hall and the playground. We also walked to the postbox near school and used the pelican crossing to cross the road. We posted letters to Father Christmas and were very excited to get a

We have been developing our social skills and friendships through the activities we take part in. We have been learning to ask others before taking toys and how to share with our friends. We have been working well as a team during our PE lessons.

In busy fingers and pen discos we have been working on diagonal lines and shapes that include diagonal lines. We have been using these lines in our drawings and mark making. We have also been using our fine motor skills to thread beads and do puzzles.













## What's been going on in Reception?

The children are working incredibly hard in phonics. We have learnt all single sounds and have now moved onto phase 3 digraphs. The children are writing CVC words daily on their whiteboards, showing increasing independence, which is amazing to see.

We have become authors in English, writing 2 books! Our first *All About Me* book had us writing about our families, favourite foods and hobbies. Our second book focussed on rhyming, where we wrote CVC rhyming words including rat, hat, dog, log, mug, rug.

In maths, we are busy securing our subitising skills, subitising different arrangements, both structured and unstructured. We are also making different arrangements of numbers within 5 and encouraging the children to talk about what they can see using positional language, developing their conceptual subitising skills.

We have thoroughly enjoyed our 'What is all around me?' topic this term, exploring the different seasons, space, our environment and celebrations. We link our topic to our art lessons, where we have drawn seasonal pictures, moon phases, created flower collages and most recently, drawn our favourite celebrations.









Year 1 have had a fantastic Autumn term! We were all so proud of their Nativity performance and impressed by their growing confidence, resilience, and independence across all areas of learning. Phonics: This term, we've focused on Phase 5 graphemes. The children are learning that many graphemes can represent more than one sound, and we've been so impressed with how well they've

English: We explored traditional tales, including The Three Billy Goats Gruff, The Princess and the Pea, and Goldilocks and the Three Bears. The children enjoyed role-playing, creating their own versions of stories, and using descriptive language to bring characters to life. Maths: Our focus has been on addition and subtraction within 10, building strong number bond skills as a foundation for tackling larger numbers later in the year.

Topic: Through our Geography question, "Where are we?", we learned basic map-reading skills and key geographical terms by exploring Hitchin, England, and the UK. In Science, we began investigating weather—how to measure it and how seasons affect it.





# What has our journey been in Year 2?

This half term the children have worked hard to consolidate their phase 5 knowledge; they have done such a fantastic job and should be very proud of themselves!



This half term's English learning has been based around the books Last Stop on Market Street and Dragon Post. The children have explored different types of books, with a focus on illustrations and then created their own illustrated piece of writing as part of a class book. We also learnt about different types of communication and then focused on letters. We researched the features of letters before writing our own letters to our heroes!

This half term in maths we completed a unit on addition and subtraction with 2-digit numbers and the children learnt to complete calculations using practical resources and a variety of strategies. We have since moved on to exploring 2D and 3D shapes and their properties.

# **Forest School**

What a glorious season your (or our!) year two outdoor thinkers have had. Such incredible sunny, cold, windy & wet days with all the glory of the colours changing and bringing the yuletide in!

We have been looking at the changing weather, what this means for animals and their habitats, thinking about hibernation and what this means for us as human animals. Talking about the importance of rest and peace and we have introduced a new area to the forest school, the chill out tree, for moments just like these, to sit and just be, to take yourself away to hibernate for a moment.

We've been mindfully wondering outside in our beautiful forest school space, exploring the wilds of the long grass, playing bears and salmons, laying on the earth and gazing at the tree canopies, imaging what is happening beneath us. Building dens and zip wires, using our hands to create places to play, unguided but supported,

leaving mental space to do it ourselves and feel all the comes with that.
