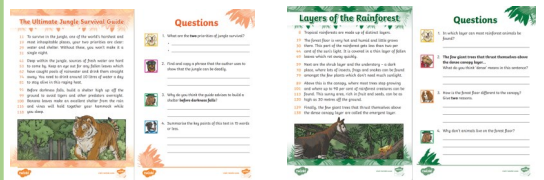
Books

We've really been able to tell how tired they are this week, so if you have to push any homework, maybe the spelling for their last test!

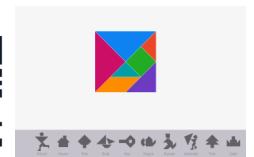
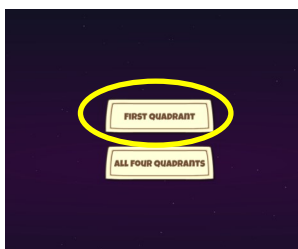


Maths

We have been learning about co-ordinates this week. We've remembered it as across (x) the corridor x axis and up the stairs y axis. I've set one worksheet for homework, which is reading and recording co-ordinates, to keep it fresh in their minds ready for our last few lessons next week. We will then have our last unit which is Roman Numerals.

There is a co-ordinates game on maths frame, but they will need to select **first quadrant** as the four quadrants might confuse them.
