Maths Fraction builder



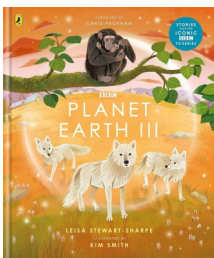
Here is the QR code for the website last week, where children can have a go at creating mixed numbers and create equivalent fractions (fractions that are equal to each other).
