Writing

This term, our text is *A Stage full of Shakespeare: Julius Caesar* by Angela McAllister.

Suggested Writing Activity:

This week, we practised some skills we already know but needed a refresher on. One of these, was using capital letters for proper nouns.

On Showbie is a worksheet where children mark someone else's work to see if they have capital letters for the proper nouns. The answers are on there too.
