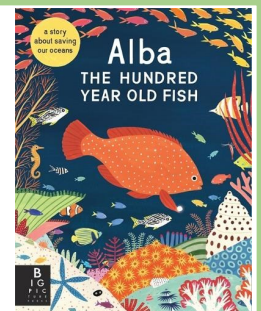

Writing

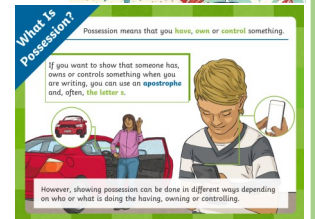
This term, our text is *Alba: The Hundred Year Old Fish* by Lara Hawthorne.



Suggested Writing Activity:

This week we practised writing apostrophes for possession (e.g. *The boy's book*). We also practised apostrophes for possession when the word is a plural (more than one) word (e.g. *The lions' food*).

There is a booklet for children to complete with 6 worksheets—so this will continue for next week as well, please remind them that they don't need to complete it all this week!
