



Badgers Learning Update Week Ending 24.11.23





We have had a great week in Badgers this week. We have continued with our Egyptian scrolls learning in art. This week, we started to think about designing our own scroll with the theme 'All About Me'. We looked again at the different symbols and patterns found in ancient Egyptian art and tried to adapt them to represent our likes and interests. We also looked at representing our names in hieroglyphics. We created a experiment page in our books where we had a play around with this. Next we used watercolour paint to experiment with creating a colour palette of earth tones. We mixed lots of colours to make different shades and tones of brown, orange, yellow, red and blue. Finally we started to think about how we might organise the symbols and patterns on our final composition and sketched out a couple of different ideas.

This week, in English we have been learning about past and present tense verbs. This has been quite tricky—especially learning the rules around how to spell past tense verbs where the root word ends in 'y'.


Reading Records

Children should be reading regularly at home, and in Year 3, we want them to develop more independence.


