Weekly Maths Tasks

Weekly Reading Task (aim to do one a day)

Daily maths lessons:

- See additional sheet. You have a maths video to watch and then a worksheet to answer questions.

Aim to do one of these a day:

- Working on Times Table Rock Stars - your child will have an individual login to access this.
- Play on [Hit the Button](#) - focus on multiplication and division facts.
- Practice telling the time. This could be done through [this game](#) (scroll down to access the game). Read to the quarter hour and the nearest 5 minutes.

- Listen to your child read and let them discuss what they have read. Encourage them to read with expression and intonation.
- Listen to a story read, [Storytime](#).
- Watch [Newsround](#) and find out what is happening in the world. What did you find out? Is there anything you need help understanding?
- Get your child to read a book they own or one on [Oxford Owl](#), discuss what your child enjoyed about the book.
- Complete a book review on one of the books you have read - what did you like about it? Would you recommend it to anyone?
- Explore new vocabulary you find when reading. What are the origins of this word? Can it be modified? Can you find any synonyms or antonyms for your new word?

Weekly Phonics/Spelling Tasks (aim to do one a day)

Weekly Writing Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

- Practice the Year 3/4 for [Common Exception words](#).
- Practise your spelling on [Spelling Shed](#).
- Practise your spelling on [Spelling Frame](#).
- Practice spellings on [Top Marks](#).
- Can you write 3 letters that are Vowels?
- Can you write 3 letters that are consonants?
- Write a spelling on a family members back using your finger. Can they guess it?

- Write a recount of from the point of view of one of the characters in a story you have read.
- Write a character description for one of the characters. What do they look like? How do they behave? etc...
- Write a story about your character. Can they go on another adventure.
- Write a fact file about a different character. What do you look like? What are your likes and dislikes?
- Follow [poetry4kids](#) how to write funny poems chapter 2. See if you can write your own rhyming poem.

### Learning Ideas

These ideas aim to provide opportunities for your child to gain a better understanding of themselves, their family and the world around them. Give one a go a day!

- *Time to Talk:* Perhaps they could play a board game, facetime a member of their family they have not seen this week, enjoy a family indoor picnic or have a family dinner.
- *Art:* Look at the [BBE Bitesize](#) website for art lessons looking at the different art elements. Can you create a piece of art about your family? [BBC Bitesize Art](#)
- *Science:* Have a look at these remote science lessons. Can you carry out an experiment at home? [STEM Science](#)
- *Understanding Others and Appreciating Differences:* Discuss how their family is different to other people's families. Discuss whether all families are the same? Does it matter? Do all families have the same faith? Do all families worship in the same way?
- *Reflect:* Find out what music their family members enjoy. Do they like the same music? What is their favourite song? They could listen to different pieces of music together with their family. Do they like/dislike any particular types of music and why? Can they identify the instruments they can hear and describe how the music makes them feel? Why not get them to listen to some of the classics?
- *Be Active:* [Go Noodle](#) with the family or have a family workout. Maybe try some yoga with your family. Recommendation at least 2 hours of exercise a week.
