There are many layers of the rainforests with all different features including habitats, plants and rainforest animals. We will be comparing biomes, vegetation belts and key features of rainforests on different continents and Antarctica.

We will be comparing the states of the rainforests back then to now and learning about why the forests are disappearing? What about the people that live there? Where are they going? Is there a way to save the rainforest?
