

What was it like to live as a Neolithic cave person?

We will be using the books 'Stone Age Boy' and 'UG' to explore life as a person living in the Stone age. We will also compare historical databases, inventions, discoveries and historical interpretations throughout this period and how they affected life styles of men, women and children.

What can history tell us?

We will be looking into the past and how historians and archaeologists have found out information from thousands of years ago and how the Stone Age progressed into the Iron Age. Why did the people settle there? How did they use the land? How did they trade with other countries?

What did people do for fun?

We will be researching what people in the stone age did for fun. We will be researching, designing, creating and evaluating clay cooking pots, inspired by the stone age. We will also be stewing fruit in an attempt to recreate a simple dish from the stone age.
