Weekly Maths Tasks (aim to do one a day)

- Watch a Numberblocks and or a shape Numberblocks clip each day at: [BBC](#) or [CBeebies](#). Use this guide [here](#) to give you ideas on what to do with your children whilst watching an episode.
- Can you show the numbers on your fingers? Can you find objects with the same number (e.g. 3 spoons) Can you write the number in the air using your finger?
- Can you feed the teddy bear in this game? Starting with numbers up to 5, then increase to numbers to 10 if you can.

- Go on a shape hunt. Count how many 2D shapes you can spot. Look out for triangles, circles, squares and rectangles.
- Sing Number songs to practice counting, reciting numbers in order, one more, one less using number songs: There was [10 in the bed](#), [5 little monkeys](#) etc.

Weekly Reading Task (aim to do one a day)

- Read a variety of books at home. Favourites can be repeated. Hearing the patterns of language in a story will support your child's language development.

Talk about the books:

- What is happening?
 - How many characters are there?
 - Who are the characters?
 - Which is your favorite characters and why?
 - How might the characters be feeling?
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- Watch and listen to [Cbeebies bedtime stories](#). Can you retell the story after?

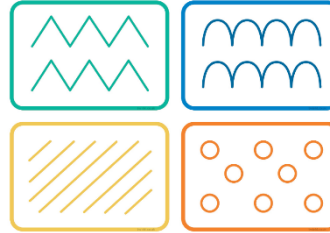
Weekly Phonics (aim to do one a day)

Weekly Writing Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

- Sing Nursery Rhymes and songs together. Add in actions and change the words. Can children think of different rhyming words to add in? Repeat old favorites and learn new rhymes. You can find an A-Z of [Nursery Rhymes here](#).
- Daily phonics – Can you go on a listening walk? What can you hear? Are the sounds loud or quiet?
- Can you make your own musical instrument at home? Can you then play it to your favorite song?



- Can they draw a picture of themselves?
- Can they use objects like sticks, Duplo, pine cones etc. to mark make?
- Can they copy the marks an adult makes? Below are some examples.



- Take part in a [dough disco here](#) Using play dough children move their fingers to develop their fine motor skills and strengthen their fingers. Here is an extra [dough disco](#) song if you are feeling ready.

Learning Projects (to be done throughout the week)

- Can you draw a picture of someone dressed for a cold winter day and then label the clothes they are wearing to keep them warm and dry? Can you find what winter clothes you need to wear to keep warm? Can you go on a walk with your winter clothes on and look for different shape/colored leaves?
- Can you freeze a toy overnight and see how long it takes to melt or for you to chip away at it? How does it feel?
- Use play dough to make your favorite arctic animals- Use ready-made play dough or make your own using this recipe: ◦ 2 cups of plain flour, one cup of salt, a tablespoon of oil, a cup of water (add gradually), a couple of drops of food coloring (optional), a teaspoon of cream of tartar (optional, but will make it last longer).
- Can you build an igloo with items in your house? Maybe use some Lego bricks, or cardboard from cereal boxes?
