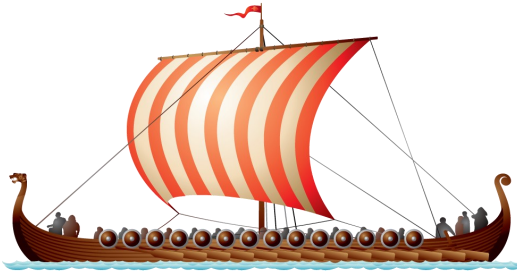


Why were Viking invasions so successful?

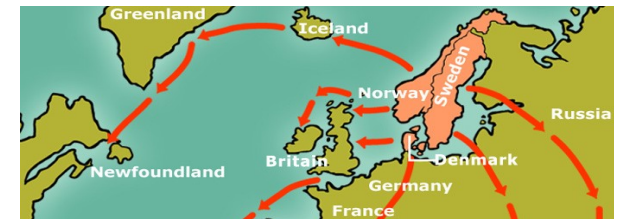
What did the Vikings wear?
