Where were children evacuated to and why?

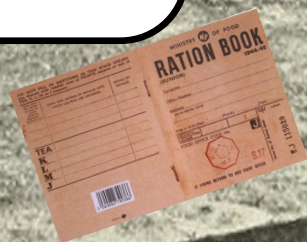
Where and how was our local area affected by WW2?
