




Key People			
	Thomas Farriner	An ember from one of Thomas' bakery ovens ignited some nearby firewood. The fire quickly spread around the room and to nearby buildings.	
	Samuel Pepys	One of they ways we know about the fire is because people wrote about it in their own personal diary.	
	King Charles II	Charles II was the King of England in 1666. After the fire, he made a decree that houses must be built further apart and built from stone not timber.	

#### London in 1666

London in 1666 was very different to what London is like now in the present day.

- The houses were made of wood and built very close together.
- The streets were cramped.
- There was no fire brigade or firefighters.
- There were no telephones.
- There were **no cars** or buses.



# Monday 3rd September 1666

The fire gets very close to the Tower of London.

Tuesday 4th September 1666

**St Paul's Cathedral** is destroyed by the fire.

**Timeline of Events** 

#### Sunday 2nd September 1666

The fire starts at 1 a.m.

Mid-morning: Samuel Pepys starts to write about the fire in his diary.


# Wednesday 5th September 1666

The wind dies down and the fire spreads more slowly.

### Thursday 6th September 1666

The fire is finally put out.

Thousands of people are left homeless.
