


Knowledge Organiser: Volcanoes

A volcano is an opening in the Earth's surface. They are usually found in a mountain and have an opening that allows gas, hot magma and ash to escape from beneath the Earth's crust. 






compose: to write or create music

duration: how long or short a sound or silence is

dynamics: how loud or quiet a sound is

graphic score: images or a mark used to write music down that is

not traditional music notation

inter-related dimensions: pitch, duration, dynamics, tempo, timbre,

texture, structure
rehearsal: to practise

structure: how a piece is organised **tempo:** how fast or slow the music is

texture: combining different layers of music to give an overall effect

timbre: the unique sound of an instrument or piece of music
