Ways to support learning at home:

* Develop a love for books and stories – buy a book using your World Book Day token. Take a photo of your child reading in the most unusual place and post it on Seesaw to share in school

* Set a weekly challenge to practise at home – using a knife and fork correctly, helping to lay the table, making your own breakfast, putting on your socks and shoes, learning how to ride a bike

* Encourage creativity and mathematical language – use recycled materials to create models. Explore and talk about the 3D shapes used
