

Sutton House Academy Sport Development Grant 2024/2025

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and Sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this' (DfE June 2013).

At Sutton House Academy we believe that PE and Sport are essential to the development of healthy minds and bodies, with the potential to change young people's lives for the better.

AIM:

ALL pupils leaving primary school physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

Objective:

To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools against 5 key indicators:

- 1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity
- 2. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
- 3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- 4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- 5. Increased participation in competitive sport

Key Indicator 1 – Engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity:

Outdoor sports infrastructure (including table tennis and Freezball stations) was installed to provide permanent, weather-resistant opportunities for physical engagement. Complemented by Daily Mile track markings and new playground activity packs, these investments ensure that every student has regular access to 30+ minutes of moderate to vigorous activity daily.

Key Indicator 2 – Raising the profile of PE and sport as a tool for whole-school improvement:

A PE Celebration Programme with assemblies, certificates, and pupil awards has been embedded to promote a culture of recognition around physical achievement. In parallel, Student Sports Leaders were trained to support leadership development and increase whole-school sports engagement.

Key Indicator 3 – Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport:

Teachers and LSAs participated in targeted CPD sessions coordinated by the School Sports Partnership. A dedicated PE planning platform subscription ensures lessons are

progressive, inclusive, and aligned to national curriculum objectives.

Key Indicator 4 – Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils:

Specialist providers delivered martial arts, yoga, and alternative physical disciplines, offering every child a chance to discover new skills and interests. This was critical in engaging those who are less inclined toward traditional team sports.

Key Indicator 5 – Increased participation in competitive sport:

Funding was allocated to allow students from all year groups to attend borough-wide events and sports competitions, with dedicated transport provided. Entry fees and equipment costs were covered to ensure inclusivity and broaden access to intra- and inter-school competition.

Through a strategic and well-balanced investment across all five key areas, the academy has ensured the 2024/2025 Sports Premium not only meets statutory criteria but creates a sustainable and inspiring physical education environment.
