Food Technology

Maths

I'm very proud of my students and their recent mock exam results. They have done so well that they will be entering GCSE exams later in the academic year. They have all worked hard to achieve these results and you as parents/carers should be proud of them too.

English - Key Stage 3

This term, Year 7s have studied two popular novels. 'Inky Stevens the Great School Detective' is a comic mystery that kept them guessing... right to the bitter

end. We also read the witty, poignant and at times heart-breaking, Louis Sachar's searing story set in the Camp Green Lake juvenile detention centre. Years 8 and 9 engaged brilliantly with their studies of Orwell's 'Animal Farm' and Michael Morpurgo's 'Private Peaceful', two very emotive books. Both books are full of jealousy, grief, joy and anger (basically all emotions). Pupils loved the history behind both books, the way they can be used to teach rhetoric and the links that can be made to what's going on in the world right now.

English - Key Stage 4

Year 10s and 11s have drawn upon a range of texts as reading stimulus and engaged with creative, as well as real and relevant contexts. Year 10s are using their critical thinking skills that encourage genuine enquiry into the topic of 'crime and punishment'. Year 11 students worked hard to complete their Functional Skills exams and we eagerly await their results. This month proved to be a challenging, yet eye opening, month where Yr11 students had another taste of an intense examination period. It was a mini taste of what will take place for real in a few months. Many of them coped very well with the exams and should be proud of the effort they put into them.

PE

Sutton House academy would like to welcome Alan to the PE department for this term. Alan has supported



all pupils in using and understanding the skills required to participate within invasion games. Over the previous 12 weeks pupils have

enjoyed games and lessons in football, rugby, basketball, netball and handball while applying the knowledge and skill level needed to perform and see positive outcomes. Next half term, will see pupils enjoy further PE lessons within the subject of net sports and gymnastics. Build-A-Bike

During our sessions students are allocated a size



appropriate mountain bike, broken down to just a frame, a set of wheels and a box of components. We then show students how to build their

bikes, how to service it and then they get to keep that bike to take home to look after as their own. This has many benefits including increased confidence and motor skills and a method by which to stay active.

RHSE Relationship, Health and Sex Education

In RHSE across the year groups we have been focusing on a range of topics from anger management, first aid, healthy living and building confidence. All pupils have shown resilience in their lessons as well as a



great understanding of their specific topic. The Year 7's have particularly enjoyed

incorporating role play in their anger management lessons. Pupils across the school have participated in 'Anti Bullying Week'. They had fun writing kind words on post it notes and giving these out to people around the school. It was fantastic to see pupils willingly engage in spreading kindness!
