Today is the start of Spring half term holidays and also marks the midway point in our calendar year. Global Day of Play

We were one of 3 schools in the country to be officially registered as celebrating the Global Day of Play, alongside hundreds of schools across the globe—spot us in the world map on the official website.

On that particular day (Friday 6th February), we were fortunate to enjoy some rare sunshine along with a host of enticing play-based activities. Classes from across the Amethyst pathway and lower school played alongside and with peers across the school and in every available space. There was some fantastic engagement as well as interactions between pupils from a range of classes and ages.



Phonics

This term, pupils in the Emerald pathway have been enjoying working in cross-class groups for their phonics lessons (teaching them to read and write through learning letter sounds and whole word reading). It has been wonderful to see their engagement and determination and as a result, they are making fantastic progress in developing their early reading skills.

Classes have also been exploring measurement and quantity, for example through making sensory bottles. They practised using language such as full, empty, more and less, counted spoonful's, followed simple instructions, and developed fine motor control while pouring and filling. The activity supported turn-taking, focus, and engagement, with lots of lovely concentration and pride in their finished bottles.



Preparing for Adulthood

Students on the Sapphire Pathway (our Sixth form) have been enjoying exciting opportunities to explore their futures beyond the classroom. Through work experience at inspiring cultural venues such as the Wallace Collection and the National Maritime Museum in Greenwich, students apply their learning to meaningful real world experiences, building confidence and resilience across different environments.

A selection of students across the pathway also attended a lively Preparing for Adulthood event in Bloomsbury, taking part in interactive workshops designed to spark ideas and explore possibilities. They discovered opportunities within their community and learned about different college pathways.

These experiences have inspired students to think positively about their futures and take important steps towards greater independence and success.



Pupil Photography

The Sapphire pathway have also been learning about photography and pupils have enjoyed taking photos of different places around the school. We learned how to change photos with filters using photo editing software.
