Lower School

The start of the Autumn Term has been a wonderful period of settling in to our new classes and rooms in the Lower School. We have created lovely, engaging learning environments for our pupils. Teaching teams have created visions for each of the classes based on real-world learning, creativity and communication.

Pupil successes have been huge through the transition period at the start of the year. Pupils have returned to their 'normal' school timetables using their personalised communication methods, working on their sensory and physical needs, and a brilliant return to swimming, which we know all families and children have enjoyed!

All pathways have engaged in the school's cross-curricular theme of 'Ourselves'. In the Informal and Early Years Foundation Stage Pathways, the pupils' engagement with their sensory stories, outdoor spaces and music has been a highlight. Pupils on the Semi-Formal Pathway are engaged with their messy and sensory play with an understanding of the world; and pupils who are in mixed semi-formal and formal classes have engaged in lessons on the Earth's health and the climate.

Literacy and communication is at the heart of learning across all pathway with classes also using the school library located on the 2nd floor. We are continuing to use Evidence for Learning to share the learning journey with you at home and to inform classroom and pathway level developments.

Thank you to those who were able to join the Family Learning Week and our first Early Years Family Coffee Morning, alongside the many individual conversations. We are learning more and more of what our Swiss community wants for our pupils – all of which is setting the scene for the work that comes next.

Upper School

Well done to everyone in Upper School for a fantastic start to the new academic year. It has been wonderful having the whole school community back together. Highlights from across the Upper School are a reflection of the personalised curriculum linked to Preparation for Adulthood.

Classes across the Upper School have engaged in lessons to explore the inspirational people their class is named after. Through the school's cross-curricular theme of 'Ourselves' pupils in the Informal Pathway have also engaged in lessons focused on the different senses and sounds.

In the Semi-Formal Pathway pupils have engaged in learning about emotions and zones of regulation, as well as preparing for returning to the community next term by role playing similar activities in the school.

Pupils in the Formal Pathway have been learning about the rainforest, the different animals that live there and the ecosystem.





Other Highlights

Apple Distinguished Schools Status:

Swiss Cottage School was invited to enter a comprehensive whole school assessment towards Apple Distinguished Schools Status. We are proud to confirm that Swiss Cottage School was successful in this yearlong assessment process. We will be joining 535 schools across 32 countries with this status, which currently only includes 42 schools across the United Kingdom. The 'champion' status is a platform for the school's role in promoting EdTech and inclusive education through our approaches with technology with the Apple Distinguished Schools strategy.

Quality in Careers Standard - Gold Award:

The school was also completed a full assessment and received confirmation that we meet the Ixion Gold Award for the Quality in Careers Standard. This assessed our Careers Education, Information, Advice and Guidance (CEIAG) provision. We are accredited as fully meeting all the accreditation criteria incorporating the national Gatsby Benchmarks. The final assessment report concluded with the summary statement that: "The way in which CEIAG is consistently embedded into students' experience of school life is exemplary. Of note also is the staff's reflective practice applied to CEIAG and the very strong sense of teamwork, by which new methods for enhancing employability and linking employers to the school has been developed, whilst retaining the need for specifically tailored provision".
