Dear Families,

We are so pleased to welcome the pupils and families back to school for the 2023-2024 academic year. The first two weeks of the academic year focus on supporting the pupils with the routines, structures, and expectations with learning alongside their class. Thank you to every family for supporting the transition of your child into the new school year. This week's newsletter is sharing key information about this half term to help us work together.

**Week 1:** 6<sup>th</sup> – 9<sup>th</sup> **September:** Transition back into the school environment last week. You received a printed newsletter with key information.

**Week 2: 11<sup>th</sup> – 15<sup>th</sup> September**: You will receive important learning information: your child's Curriculum Pathway and Overview of classmates and teaching team, Class Timetable, Autumn Term Targets (known as Personal Learning Intention Map). The 'Data Collection Sheet' is also in your child's pack. Please check the information and return on Monday, 18<sup>th</sup> September. Your child's Evidence for Learning Journal will have photos of the classroom environment and visual timetables.

**Week 3: 18**th – **22**nd **September**: You will receive the Medium Term plan sharing the themes and focus for learning across this term. You will receive the date and time of your child's 'Family Learning Week' lesson which is scheduled to take place during Week 6. 'Evidence for Learning' journal upload into the family portal this week.

**Week 4: 25<sup>th</sup> – 29<sup>th</sup> September**: The school is holding the new academic year Information Session. This provides you with information on the School Provision, Curriculum Pathways, Multi-Agency Provision with NHS Therapists, and an opportunity to meet the Leadership Team and other parents/carers. The session is optional and will run three times across the day. Register your place using the electronic link.

Week 5: 2<sup>nd</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> October: 'Evidence for Learning' journal upload into the family portal this week.

**Week 6: 9<sup>th</sup> – 13<sup>th</sup> October**: Family Learning Week: This is an opportunity for you to join your child in their class for a learning activity, and to meet the other parents. The date and time is confirmed on Week 3.


**Week 7: 16<sup>th</sup> – 20<sup>th</sup> October**: 'Evidence for Learning' journal upload into the family portal. During the last week of the half term, we will celebrate the successes from the half term across both Lower School, Upper School, and Sixth Form through an End of Half Term Newsletter for all families.

**Home – School Communication**: Day to day communication between the home and class teacher is through the 'home-school communication book'. Every pupil receives their Swiss Cottage School home-school communication book today.

Teachers and the class team are preparing the day's learning activities from 8:30-9:30 and teaching from 9:30-3:30. The teacher is able to pick up phone call messages and emails from the school day at 3:45-4:00pm. If you email after school hours (4:30pm to 8:30am) it will be picked up by the class teacher at 3:45pm the next day. We also communicate with you through a weekly newsletter. This is sent via email, text, and through the school website.

**Autumn Term Family Workshops:** We have already enjoyed an Evidence for Learning workshop and a Speech and Language workshop with parents/carers. On Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> October there is an optional workshop on the Annual Review process at 10.30am. Our weekly Tuesday coffee mornings continue this half-term, starting on 19<sup>th</sup> September at 10.30 as usual.

**Curriculum Pathways:** Your pack includes an overview of our 5 Curriculum Pathways and the curriculum pathway that your child is following this year. The names of each pathway has changed this year to reflect our focus on a personalised curriculum for the complex special educational needs profiles at Swiss Cottage School.



**Data Collection Sheet:** We need to ensure the information for your child is correct. This letter includes your child's Data Collection Sheet. The school holds this pupil / family information securely through a protected system. Please complete this and return it on Monday, 18th September.
