### **Anti bullying week**

Some of the activities that took place included; Year 1 using their oracy skills to predict which material would make the best umbrella for Ted, Year 2 used Colourful Semantics to build expanded noun phrases and Y6 took part in hands on Maths with weighing scales, tape measures, and jugs used to estimate and measure mass, capacity, and length



### **Pupil Wellbeing Champions**

This half term we have recruited and relaunched our Pupil Wellbeing Champions. They have attended the launch part of their training. This was provided by One Goal. One Goal training is planned to continue throughout the year for this pupil leadership group.



Chris Webb MP launched our School Election campaign with a visit to Boundary. After this, the school took to the polls. The votes were counted and verified and the results announced during a results assembly.

# **Moor Park Primary School**

It has been such a busy start to the year at Moor Park. Here are some of our celebrations:

### **No Pen Morning**

Earlier in the term we celebrated 'No Pen Morning' across school. In Year 2 they carried out practical activities in maths and English using different ways to show learning instead of using pencils and pens. In maths we used a range of resources to partition numbers and also learned a new game using dice to get speedy at adding! We enjoyed orally creating our own stories in English.

### **Together time**

We invited parents/carers into school to visit classrooms to support their children's learning. There was a range of activities taking place from building electrical circuits, making parachutes, phonics and music.

Our Sports Captains had the opportunity to go to Blackpool FC and take part in 'Show Racism the Red Card' event. This day was full of important learning and experiences which the children are going to bring back to Moor Park and share. They had a wonderful day: they got to see the first team changing rooms, take part in lots of activities and even got to meet a Blackpool player.

#### Space week

Miss Woods launched our Space week with an exciting whole-school assembly on life beyond Earth, from microgravity and the International Space Station to NASA's legendary pizza parties! KS2 pupils became scientists, testing how body position affects reaction time with a ruler drop experiment. KS1 tackled astronaut training at their own NASA Space Camp before designing creative, nutritious space meals. Early Years explored rockets, learning their parts and launching bottle rockets sky-high! An out-of-this-world week of curiosity, creativity, and cosmic fun at Moor Park!

### **World Mental Health Day**

This year's theme was 'access to services - mental health in catastrophes and emergencies'. Our Wellbeing Ambassadors supported the children in their classes in a Tea and Talk session on ways to look after their Mental Health and why talking about this helps them. Some of the children went on to create posters to help others with strategies they can use to support our mental health.

### Geography

This half term, children at Moor Park have started their new Geography units. In Key Stage 1, they have thoroughly enjoyed using our new atlases to explore hot and cold places around the world and studying aerial photographs of our local area to identify key features

#### Eat well, move more

This half term, Year 2 have enjoyed working with Shannon and Megan from Active Blackpool. We have spent the last 6 weeks learning how to 'Eat Well and Move More'. We have learned about different fruits and vegetables, the importance of walking to school and getting exercise and how to swap our treats for healthy snacks. We finished with a 'festival' wearing our head and sweat bands to dance to party songs. We certainly got lots of exercise!
