The children successfully took over the running of the school and did an excellent job. Many volunteers attended our careers fair, from a range of sectors, sharing their roles and responsibilities. Year 4 enjoyed their fieldwork trip planning a route using maps and then walking all the way to the beach! Year 1 visited Stanley Park in heritage week to explore our local area. Finally, our KS2 SATs results were excellent. Our downward trend of Reading GDS is now back on track and all other results are inline with the emerging national figures.

Exciting Trips and Experiences

- Show Town Museum Visit: KS3 pupils from Square Class enjoyed an educational trip to the Show Town Museum. Our pupils have been working hard to help make the museum accessible for everyone.
- Gruffalo Clubhouse: Early Years Rainbow Class had a fantastic day at the Gruffalo Clubhouse, which supported their work on Julia Donaldson stories.
- Special School Music Festival: Our choir shone brightly at the Special School Music Festival in May, with an outstanding performance in front of a large audience.
- Grand Theatre Visit: KS3 Pentagon pupils had the exciting opportunity to watch "The Boy at the Back of the Class" at the Grand Theatre in Blackpool. They thoroughly enjoyed the show and made us all proud.
- Community visits: Our KS2 pupils have been out on a number of community visits including to our local park and shops.
- -Preparation for Adulthood: Our sixth form students took the bus to visit a cafe. This was a great opportunity to practise a number of important skills out in the community. Additionally, our KS4 class visited Stanley Park where they placed their own orders at the cafe.

Elmer Trail Adventure

The term began with our very own Highfurlong Hattie entering the Elmer Trail. Pupils and families were incredibly passionate about completing the trail and, together, we raised an amazing £900 for Brian House.

- Some of our secondary pupils enjoyed a two-day residential visit to Bendrigg Outdoor Experience, participating in a variety of activities that will contribute to their Duke of Edinburgh Awards.
- Both our lower and upper school sports days were a huge success. The upper school sports day took place at Blackpool Sports Centre, and our secondary and sixth form students represented our school wonderfully.

Creative and Active Endeavours

- Move Day Visitors: The whole school participated in Chinese dancing and outdoor adventures. Additionally, we held a glow-in-the-dark dodgeball event in the school hall, which was a unique and fun experience for everyone involved.
- Tales Retold Performance: KS3 pupils put on an excellent performance at the Grand Theatre as part of their project with Tales Retold.
- Each class had their Summer Pool Party, where they played games and had lots of splashing fun!
- Our sixth formers have had weekly workshops with House of Wingz, learning to dance, rap, and create street art.

Summer Fair Success

Our pupils worked incredibly hard to make our Summer Fair a success, with all the gifts being handmade by them as part of our Enterprise journey. We are so proud of their creativity and effort.

Celebrations and Farewells

A Note on Progress



Stanley Primary School





We have had a wonderful Summer term to end the academic year at Stanley. Each week has brought so many proud moments to share with our children, our families and our local community.

We started the term celebrating the unveiling of 'Bubbles', our very own Elmer the elephant. Children from across our school washed, primed and painted our Elmer for the Wild in Art trail; the very first one of its kind to be held here in Blackpool. Our children and families thoroughly enjoyed joining Elmer's Big Parade and we celebrated raising over £1000 for Brian House.

We were also delighted this term to be awarded Music Ambassador status. Blackpool Music Service joined us for a day to film music provision across school and we are looking forward to attending the music ambassador presentation next week.



We have continued to participate in a huge range of sporting events across Blackpool, attending over 14 events at the Blackpool Youth Games. We won the Primary Blackpool Cross-Country Championship as a school, and are incredibly proud to have also achieved first place in the Blackpool and Lancashire Panathlon Championship. Our Panathlon team went on to compete at the North-West finals, placing second after a point countback from a draw for first place.

As a school we held five sports days, welcoming over 1000 parents, friends and family to watch their children take part in an array of sporting challenges. The sun actually shone for five days! Year Three visited Ribchester Roman Museum, Year two visited the Blackpool Coastline, Y5 enjoyed a visit to Blackpool Synagogue and twenty Year 6 children visited the Houses of Parliament, Downing Street and took a flight on the London Eye.





We have had many visitors in Stanley this term as we are always striving to improve the educational experiences that enrich our curriculum. We were especially lucky to have Dermot O'Leary at school for an afternoon. He gave an inspirational talk to children, staff and visitors and shared his new book 'Wings of Glory' with the children.

Our newly formed PTFA have been an amazing support, raising just short of £2000 in their first year. We have purchased a new portable sound system which was used for the first time in our Y6 Leaver's concert 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory'. Our team in Stanley, together with parents, family and friends were treated to our equivalent of a West End production! The children have lots to celebrate as they finish their primary journey with us; as a cohort they have beaten the National averages in the KS2 headline attainment measures.


