
Highfurlong School

What an incredible Autumn term we have had here at Team Stanley! Our school has been buzzing with energy and progress, and we are thrilled to share all the exciting developments and achievements with you.

The summer holidays saw much-needed improvements to the school building, including exterior painting and decoration, as well as the addition of our special educational needs resource provision, Embrace. This new provision offers our children access to tailored indoor and outdoor spaces that cater specifically to their needs. It's been wonderful to see the children settle in so well, quickly becoming an integral part of our school community.



At Stanley, we are committed to enriching our children's educational experiences, and this term has been filled with countless opportunities for them to learn, grow, and explore. We've had some fantastic educational visits and experiences. Year 6 enjoyed an adventurous weekend at the Waterpark Outdoor Learning Centre in Coniston, where they tried their hands at ghyll scrambling, sailing, kayaking, climbing, and much more. Year 1 went on a local walk as part of their Geography studies, while Year 2 explored Blackpool Zoo for their Science unit. Thanks to our pupils' fundraising efforts—through bake sales and non-uniform days—we were able to significantly reduce the cost of these educational visits.

We've also seen some fantastic competitive successes! Our school won the Blackpool Panathlon for the second consecutive year and are gearing up for the next round of competition in the new year. We also triumphed in the Blackpool Mixed Cup Football Tournament and are looking forward to representing Blackpool in the Lancashire Cup. Our Year 2 Fit2Glo team took first place in the initial stage of the Fit2Glo festival and came third in the overall final. Our athletics team placed third out of 12 Blackpool schools, and we're preparing to defend our two-year consecutive title at the Blackpool Cross Country Championships. Additionally, our girls' football team has enjoyed continued success and is looking forward to more fixtures in the new year.







We were honoured to host three very well-known authors this term. In October, Jack Meggitt-Phillips visited, and just last week, we welcomed Jacqueline Wilson and Hazel Gardiner. The children had the opportunity to attend workshops led by these talented writers, which was truly inspiring for them. We also had Oliver Langford, an English Football League referee, deliver an exciting workshop for our Year 5 and Year 6 children, offering a fascinating insight into the world of refereeing. In addition, a dance workshop from The Lowry saw Year 5 students creating and performing expressive interpretive sequences.

Also a huge well done to all of our pupils for their incredible performances in our Christmas nativities and carol services.







The Maple School

As the first term comes to a close our school community reflects on a period filled with growth, learning and achievement. Thank you to all students, staff and families for your dedication and support.

This term Local MP Chris Webb visited school and was greeted by the school council. Mr. Webb was given a tour of school and then hosted a Q&A session with the students.

Some students had the opportunity to attend the 'Show Racism the Red Card' campaign in partnership with Blackpool and the Fylde College. The event helped the students to understand equality and what it means in the wider community.

For Harvest this year students took part in the Harvest Festival challenge. They had to use their numeracy, budgeting and teamwork skills to buy food produce to donate to the local food bank. Also for Christmas the students have been collecting for Streetlife and writing Christmas cards to local residents.

This term we have also seen the launch of our new school name, accompanied with branding and a new website. In January the uniform will be available and all signage completed.

We also welcomed families to a coffee morning that was supported by Blackpool Council, Blackpool Mental Health Services and other agencies. This was a great opportunity for families to come into school and see all of the changes that have been made since September.




















Moor Park Primary School

We have had a fantastic start to the year at Moor Park Primary School. Since September, so much has happened!

DfE Visit – We were chosen by the English Hub to showcase the work the school has done on the Voice 21 project. During the last Voice 21 Development Day we were described as a Beacon of Excellence – a fantastic opportunity to share our success with the DfE. This was shared on Facebook and in the Gazette

Hive and Halo creation! Over the summer holidays we had lots of building work completed in school to create our two new SEND provisions funded by the LA: The Halo, an 8 place provision for reception children and the Hive, a 16 place provision for KS1 / KS2 children. Both provisions have got off to a calm start with good feedback from external consultants / professionals.

We now have an Educational Psychologist and counselling weekly in school which is benefitting our children massively!

KS1 playground Markings – New, bright markings on the KS1 playground added over the summer. Children love using these at the start and end of the day as well as at playtime!

Pupil Leadership – we have established our Pupil Leadership Team including School Council, Head Boy and Girl and Sports Captains.

Democracy Week - During this week children were able to put forward cases to their classes as to why they wanted to be a School Councillor. Children voted for the councillor they wanted. The successful councillors were announced in assembly and badges given. We had our first meeting and shared some of the areas they felt needed attention in school. We chose three key points to work on: 1) Fund raising for Crumble the guide dog (our chosen charity) 2) Plants in classrooms 3) Quiet areas on the KS1 and KS2 playground.

Black History Month – History Lead gave year groups key, influential black people to study including black women in history. Children designed posters for this.

Space Week – An exciting week of learning about space. A home learning competition to learn about living in space. We had a fantastic response to this including videos / booklets / posters made at home. The winner got to meet Tim Peake!

Eco Green Flag – At the end of the summer term we were awarded the Eco Green flag (with distinction).

Thank you to everyone who attended one of our Christmas performances. The children performed beautifully and we are so proud of them. In English lessons Year 2 have been busy writing letters to Father Christmas. They put them all into an envelope and walked down to the post box to post them.

In September we were proud to welcome Moor Park Primary School and The Maple School to the Synergy family. This has led to further collaborative working between all of our schools leading to school improvements and an enhanced educational offer for our pupils.

Highfurlong School's new building was finally completed and some of the team went to the Christmas fair and were able to visit the new community cafe 'Canteen' and enterprise shop.

The central finance team have been working incredibly hard on preparing the financial accounts for audit and also onboarding two new schools. The team were also externally audited by the ESFA and subject to an internal scrutiny audit. We are pleased to say that all audits were passed with flying colours with only minor amendments.

This term we have launched our new Synergy website www.seteducation.org.uk and also our social media profiles on Facebook and Linkedln. Please have a look and share with friends and family.

We have also been working hard on pulling together the Trust wide policies and are pleased to say these have all now been ratified by the Trustees and implemented across all schools. The operations team are currently going out to tender for new telecoms and ICT providers for the Trust to be implemented in April 2025.

In November the Synergy central team moved offices to Stanley Primary School. This move promotes further collaborative working across the whole team and is in a central location to all Synergy Schools.

The team have also been busy visiting schools all term working with leaders on school development planning, estate management, communication and marketing. My Money Matters- Shared AVC (Additional Voluntary Contributions)

What is an AVC?

Synergy Education Trust is now working with My Money Matters to facilitate our salary sacrifice Shared Cost Additional Voluntary Contribution (Shared Cost AVC) scheme.

This benefit is available to **all** Local Government Pension Scheme members that helps you save more for your retirement. The platform will be available from 2nd January 2025.

The AVC allows you to build an additional pot of money alongside your pension contributions, saving you tax and national insurance contributions at the same time, with the potential of a tax-free lump sum when you retire.

How does it work?

The AVCs are held with the AVC provider (Prudential) and are processed via a reduction in your salary via a salary sacrifice arrangement.

What next?

If you would like to take advantage of this opportunity, you need to register on the My Money Matters platform to begin the process.

My Money Matters have a team of experts with many years' experience in public sector pensions and are available for you to book in a Coaching Session.

This session will give you an opportunity to learn more about the benefits of switching to a Shared Cost AVC scheme and how you can manage your scheme through our new platform and learn all about the exciting financial wellbeing service that you now have access to.


Savings Example

An exciting opportunity has become available at The Maple School.

Since September 2024, The Maple School has introduced the Read, Write Inc. Phonics Programme - Fresh Start.

They are looking for a Teaching Assistant to deliver this programme to identified pupils in the school and also work alongside The Maple SLT and the Director of Education at Synergy Trust, to develop a library for the pupils within the school.

About The Maple School

The Maple School is a specialist provision for secondary aged pupils with Social, Emotional and Mental Health needs. The school has been purpose built to accommodate pupils who have an Education, Health and Care Plan. Maple can cater for up to 48 students, ranging from Year 6 to Year 11. All students have access to a number of curriculum pathways which deliver all core subjects, meaningful qualifications, and therapeutic interventions that will help them to develop and fully engage with school life.

The school is committed to ensuring that all its pupils can read, which is why they have adopted this specific approach.

The Role

- Experience of RWI is not essential as training will be provided however an understanding of phonics teaching would be helpful.
- The role would entail one to one phonics sessions with pupils daily.
- All sessions are resourced and scripted.
- · Ongoing Phonics training will be available.
- The role will be based in the library area. The successful candidate will help shape the design and development of it.
