- Make a presentation about famous people from North and South American history.
- Write a newspaper report about a famous event that occurred in North or South America.
- Research and then write about animals indigenous to one of the North American or South American regions.
- Design a poster or leaflet to encourage tourists to visit an area of The Americas.
- Create a piece of artwork on one of the new Wonders of the World found in The Americas.
- Design and create your own Mayan headdress, mask or jewellery. Write a paragraph about why these were worn.
- Draw or make a Mayan temple. Write about why the temples were so important to the Mayans.

Explore your mathematical skills:

- Create a timeline of important events in the history of The Americas.
- Plan a trip to an area of your choice, costing up flights, accommodation and places to visit during the trip.
- Create a graph to show the population of each country in North and South America.

Extend your research skills:

- Whereabouts in the world did the Mayans live? Use a map to find out! Can you plot the different Mayan cities on the map?
- Can you research a Mayan city in more detail? What can you find out about it? What was it like? Write a fact file about it or create a leaflet to explain what you have found out.
