Dear Parents,

Thank you to the Tanworth PTA who created such a memorable event last Friday, the Christmas Fayre. It was lovely to see so many adults and children enjoying Tinsel Town. A lot of hard work goes into organising these events, very often months in advance, so it is always great when so many people attend. A special thank you to Georgina, Sarah and Gemma who always go above and beyond to ensure that every event is enjoyable for the children.

Then on Thursday, 14 of us took part in the wreath making workshop. This was a great new addition to the PTA calendar, I even brought my Mum along!

This week we have seen the start of the Christmas productions in school. Reception did two marvellous performances of 'Wriggly Nativity' to their family members. It was lovely to see the children performing on the stage with huge smiles and singing beautifully. Thank you to Miss Evens for bringing it all together and to Mrs Jones, Miss Davis and Miss Buckingham for their support also.

Although Christmas is now well and truly in full swing, it is business as usual behind the scenes. On Monday this week I had a visit from Paula Taylor who is our Targeted Support Officer (TSO) from Warwickshire Attendance Service. Their role is to work alongside schools to help improve attendance and ensure every child is accessing education regularly. During the visit, we reviewed our attendance procedures, looked at attendance patterns across the school, and discussed ways to support families where attendance is a concern. The focus was on early help, positive support, and working together to remove any barriers that may affect a child's ability to attend school regularly. Good attendance is essential for every child's learning and wellbeing. If you ever need help or advice about attendance, please contact us, we are all here to support you.

Then on Wednesday we welcomed our Health & Safety consultant who carried out a full audit of our site along with our procedures and practices. These audits are a normal part of keeping our school safe and ensuring we meet all statutory requirements. During the visit, the consultant inspected the school building and grounds and reviewed key policies, risk assessments and emergency procedures. The purpose of the audit is to ensure that our school continues to provide a safe, secure environment for all children, staff, and visitors. We are pleased that the visit was positive, and any recommendations made will be acted on promptly.

Linked to Health and Safety, we are delighted to share that our recent CIF (Condition Improvement Fund) bid has been successful, enabling us to significantly enhance the security of our school site. Over the coming months, we will hopefully be installing new perimeter fencing and upgraded access-controlled gates.

These improvements are an important part of our ongoing commitment to safeguarding. Strengthening the boundaries of our site helps ensure that all children, staff, and visitors remain safe throughout the school day and also to secure the site outside of school hours and during the holidays. We will keep parents updated as the work progresses.

Finally, over the next couple of weeks each class will be having their 'Protective Behaviours' learning. This is where children discuss feeling safe, discuss their early warning signs and also discuss what to do if they do not feel safe. One of the things all children will be discussing is their 'hand of trust', this is identifying 5 people that they can trust and would speak to if they do not feel safe. Each finger represents a person that they trust and they know they could speak to. Ask your child who is on their hand of trust.

## LEAVE OF ABSENCE DURING TERM TIME

### UPDATED INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

The Supreme Court has clarified the law on unauthorised leave, including holidays, during term time (Platt v Isle of Wright 2017). The Supreme Court has made clear that attending school 'regularly' means that the children must attend school on every day that they are required to do so. As such, the parents of any child who is absent from school without authorisation for any length of time are likely to be considered as committing an offence under s444 of the Education Act 1996.

The law states a leave of absence may only be granted by a school if an application is made in advance and if it considers there are exceptional circumstances relating to the application.

Schools must judge each application individually considering the specific facts and circumstances and relevant background context behind each request.

A leave of absence is granted entirely at the school's discretion. Generally, a need or desire for a holiday or other absence for the purpose of leisure and recreation would not constitute an exceptional circumstance.

Where a leave of absence is granted, the school will determine the number of days a pupil can be absent from school.

When making an application for Leave of Absence parents are advised to give sufficient information and time to allow the Head teacher the opportunity to consider all the exceptional circumstances and to notify parents of their decision. The school may also request further information on the application and supporting documentation where appropriate.

It is advised that if the resident parent has not received notification or a response regarding the leave of absence application, it is the parents' responsibility to ascertain if the leave is authorised prior to the start of the leave.

The school can only consider Leave of Absence requests which are made by the 'resident' parent ie the parent with whom the child normally resides.

Where applications for leave of absence are made in advance and refused, the child is expected to be in school on the dates set out in the application. If the child is absent during that period, it will be recorded as an unauthorised absence. Where a leave of absence is requested, but additional days taken either prior to or after the request may be considered as part of the leave of absence.

Leave of Absences which are not made in advance cannot be authorised in line with legislation. This will result in the absence being recorded as 'unauthorised'.

All matters of unauthorised absence relating to a Leave of Absence will be referred to the Warwickshire Attendance Service, part of Warwickshire County Council. Penalty Notices are issued in accordance with Warwickshire County Council's Code of Conduct for Penalty Notices and in the first instance, as an alternative to prosecution proceedings.

The law relating to Penalty Notices changed with effect from 19 August 2024. Therefore, Penalty Notices issued for Leave of Absence taken from September 2024 will be issued in accordance with the updated legislation.

- Penalty Notices are issued to each parent of each absent child, (for example 2 children and 2 parents, means each parent will receive 2 invoices – 4 in total).
- First Leave of Absence offence: The Penalty Notice amount of £160 to be paid within 28 days, this is reduced to £80 each child if paid within 21 days.
- Second Leave of Absence offence within a 3 year period (from the date of issue of the first penalty notice): The amount of £160 paid within 28 days. No reduced amount.
- Payment plans will not be offered and/or payments received outside of the 28 day period will not be accepted. Where a penalty notice expires unpaid the matter will be referred to Warwickshire County Council's Legal Services to consider criminal prosecution.
- Third Leave of Absence offence within a 3 year period (from the date of issue of the first penalty notice): A penalty notices will be not be issued and the matter will be referred to Warwickshire County Council's Legal Services to consider instigating criminal prosecution proceedings under S444 of Education Act 1996.
