

Develop your creativity:

- Imagine you are an evacuee. Write a letter home to your family explaining what has happened to you.
- Design and make a parachute that will significantly slow down the fall for a toy soldier.
- Make your own artefact from World War 2 - this could be a rationing book, an evacuation case, a gas mask, soldier's helmet, a medal etc.
- Design and make a mini air raid shelter.
- Research propaganda and how it was used. Create your own propaganda poster to boost morale during the war.
- Write a song for the soldiers to boost morale and encourage them to victory!

Explore your mathematical skills

- Find out the cost of rationed items. How much would you spend on a week's food?
- Find out how many soldiers fought and died in WW2 from each country that was involved. Choose a graph to present your findings. Create and answer questions about your data, for example, Which country had the most soldiers?
- Make and play a game of battleships!

Beauty in the detail: Choose something which makes you happy or connected with the world. It might be a pet or a flower for example. Look at it carefully and notice the detail in it. Respond in words, draw a picture or take a photograph and enjoy being in that moment.

Extend your research skills:

- Research an aircraft, ship or tank that took part in WW2. Make a model, drawing or collage and don't forget to include a description.
- Research a famous immigrant, where have they come from? Where have they moved to, and why?
- What protection did people have during WW2? Find out how and why people used these methods. Choose how to present your findings.
- What was the Blitz? Research and choose how you wish to present your findings.

Explore:

- Do you have anyone in your family who was in WW2? Create a presentation on them.
- Research a WW2 recipe and make it at home. Photograph the meal and write out the recipe.
- Find out where children were evacuated from and to in England. Show this on a map.
- Write a newspaper article about an event in WW2.
