PARENT / CARERS' COMMITMENT

I/We agree to support the Tany's Dell Way by...

- ✓ Supporting and upholding all school policies.
- ✓ Keeping good channels of communication between home and school through use of the home/school book, which I / we will read, (*comment upon if appropriate*) and **sign on a weekly basis** and reading diaries.
- ✓ Making sure that my child attends school regularly and punctually, informing the school immediately of any reasons for absence. An absence note will be sent into school upon my child's return.
- ✓ Ensuring that my child is wearing full school uniform, which also includes appropriate hair management, and attends with the items necessary for the school day – e.g. PE kit, Reading and Library books.
- ✓ Working in close partnership with the school and ensuring early contact to discuss matters which may affect my child's happiness and/or academic progress. **I will fully support the school in managing my child's behaviour.**
- ✓ Working with the teacher in supporting and encouraging my child's learning by:
 - Attending Parent/Teacher Consultations
 - Reading with my child on a daily basis and supporting the school's library systems.
 - Regularly supporting my child to practise basic literacy and numeracy skills, especially spelling and times tables.
 - Supporting my child to complete their homework activities and ensure they are handed in on time.
- ✓ Encouraging my child to develop a positive attitude to personal hygiene, and be responsible for **regular checking for head lice**.
- ✓ Making sure that my child does not watch inappropriate programmes which are scheduled after the 9.00 pm watershed.
- ✓ Using parental control locks on computers and other internet devices which my child can access and to take due care that they are not exposed to DVDs or electronic games which are classified as unsuitable for their age group.
- ✓ Monitoring my child's internet access – thereby keeping themselves and their peers safe online.
- ✓ Ensuring any monies due to the school are fully paid in advance, eg. Dinner Money, Educational Visits etc... **It is good practice to ensure you have a healthy Parent Pay balance** – why not set up a standing order?
- ✓ Complying with the school security regulations and treat all members of the school community with respect.
