# End of Term

As we approach the end of the Autumn Term, we would like to give you an update on school life, information about the end of this term and in preparation for the new term. # Year 11

We have reached the end of the Practice Examination series for this year group. As a school we would like to recognise their excellent conduct, coupled with their resilience and preparation for the exams. In the new year, we will communicate these results with students and families through the 'Brown Envelope' process, which rehearses the exams results session in the summer. This is in mid-January.

# Site Development Update

By January 8, the first day of the new term, we anticipate and welcome the completion of the next phase of the works. Marked on the map with a corresponding number, here is the site information for the start of the new term:

- 1. Students should continue to access school via the Yarrow Drive with the gate shutting at 8.45am prompt.
- 2. The existing entry gate for cars will retreat around 100 metres, nearer to the entrance from Hesketh Lane.
- 3. The car park will be in use for staff and visitors there will be no parking at the back of school. Parents and visitors should use the school reception to enter the building.
- 4. Buses will come onto the school site and use the bus lane. This means that students will line up at the bus stops.
- 5. Stagecoach bus 2 (a public bus), which goes to Southport or Preston will continue to pull into the drive at the front of school.
- 6. The outdoor communal areas, including the shelter will be completed.
- 7. The MUGA pitches will be completed and ready for use.

There will be a full site check on Friday 5 January and if there are any changes, we will be in touch with you before the start of term.
