My favourite things to do are travelling to different countries to explore, watching movies, spending quality time with my family, I have two children of my own, so I value family time.

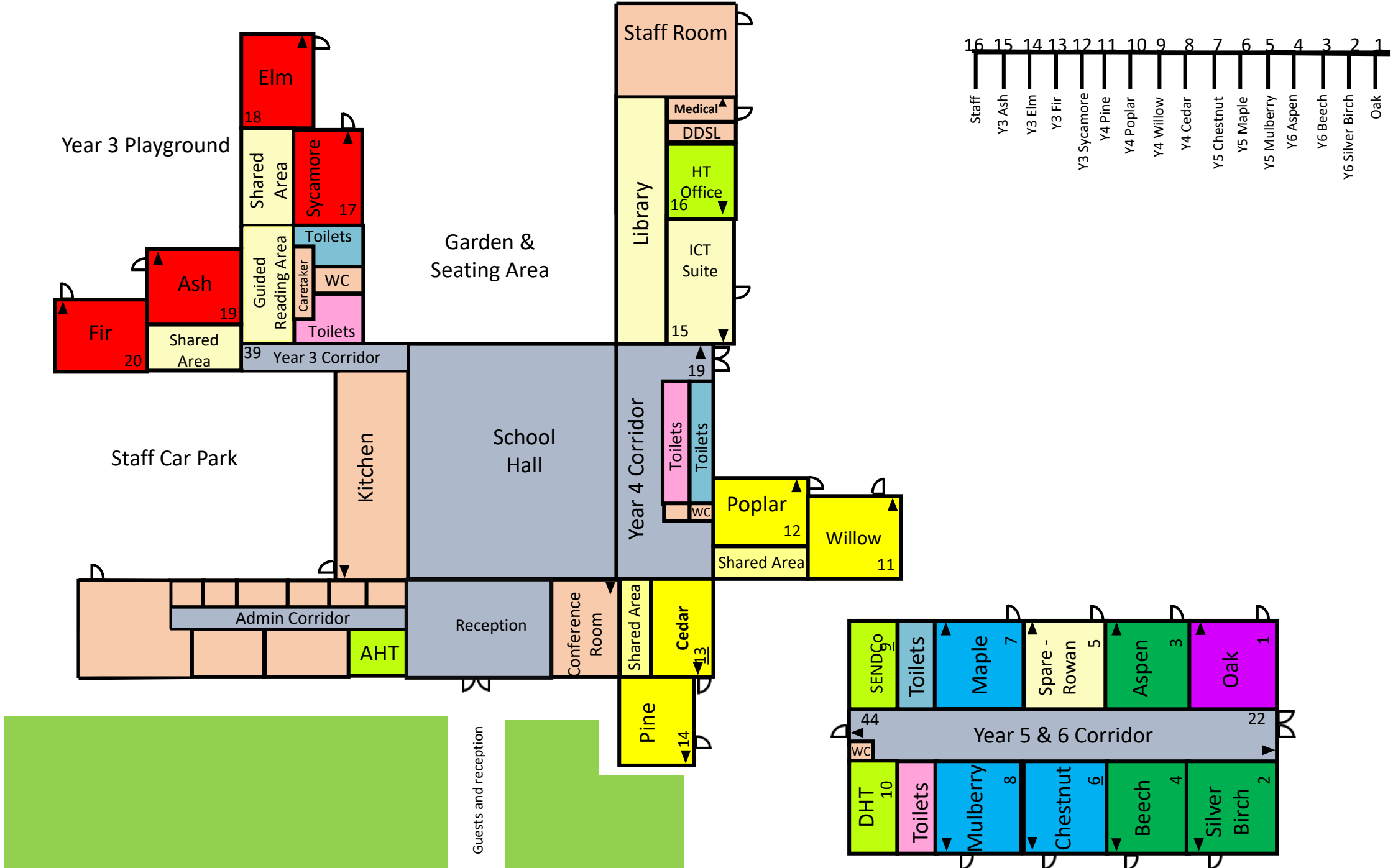

MyChildAtSchool (MCAS)



- Thames View Juniors is a cash free school.
- All payments will be able to be processed through MCAS.
- Breakfast club can be booked this way, the full school year will be available to book from day 1 of the school year.
- Trips will be made available to you to enrol your child into via MCAS, by enrolling you are giving your consent for your child to attend.
- Afterschool clubs will be available for purchase on MCAS, Homework clubs become available first then activity club usually start on the 2nd week in September. Ad-Hoc homework club is available at all times should you need a one-off placement



Olive Dining



This year we are using a new caterer for school lunches, named Olive Dining.

There is no booking required, your child will be able to make their selection at the counter.

Pupil Premium / Free School Meals

If you are in receipt of certain benefits, you may be entitled to claim Pupil Premium funding, this is also known commonly as Free School Meals, but this is not all that the funding covers.

If your claim is approved, you will receive several additional areas of financial benefit

- Breakfast Club, normally costing **£1.50** will no longer be charged
- Some trips may be reduced in cost (the year 6 residential one is usually discounted with this funding)
- After-school Clubs are discounted from **£18 to £11**
