Miss Iwona – Learning Support Assistant

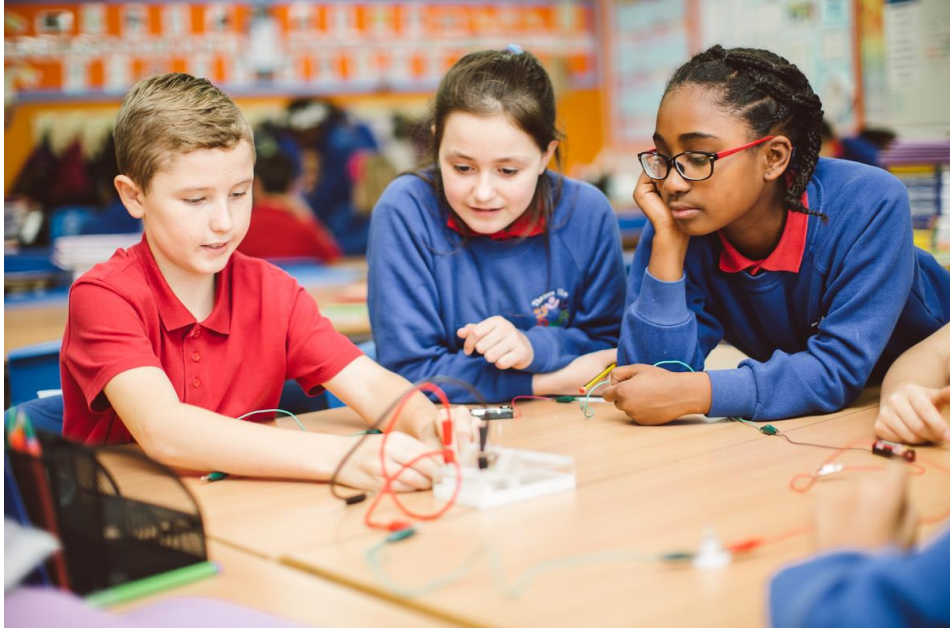


Hello, my name is Ms Iwona, and I have been working as an LSA at Thames View Junior for two years.

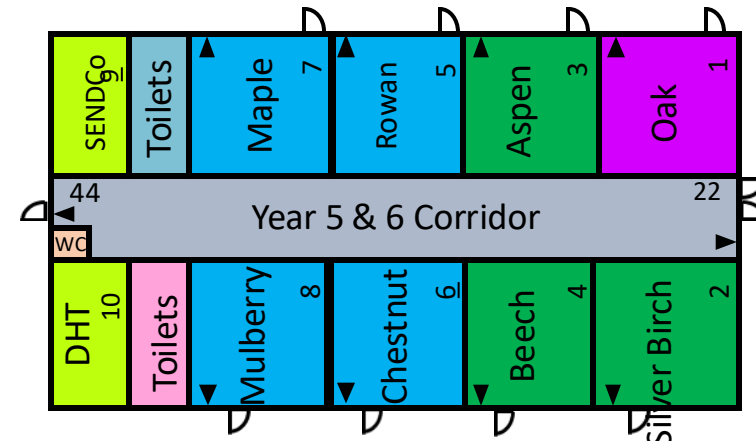

The School Uniform



- A Polo shirt:
 - Year 3– Red
 - Year 4– Yellow
 - Year 5– Blue
 - Year 6– Green
- Royal blue jumper/cardigan/fleece.
- Plain grey or black skirt, trousers or shorts.
- Summer dress in year group colours.
- Plain black shoes (no patterns, no logos, no trainers).
- Small stud earrings (no hoops) and no other jewellery unless for religious reasons.
- Hair must be naturally coloured (plain blue, black or white hair accessories, no patterns) – no unnatural hair dyes allowed

This colour shirt will remain with the year groups, not with your child.

MyChildAtSchool (MCAS)

- Thames View Juniors is a cashless school.
- All payments will be able to be processed through **MCAS**(MyChildAtSchoolApp)
- **Breakfast Club:** Available to book for the full school year from the first day of term.
- **School Trips:** Book and provide consent for your child to attend through MCAS.
- **After-School Clubs:** Homework Club bookings open first, with activity clubs usually starting in the second week of September. Ad-hoc Homework Club sessions can be booked at any time if you need a one-off place.





Olive Dining

Our catering provider is **Olive Dining**, offering a varied menu with recipes developed to suit children's tastes.

There is **no need to pre-book** school meals. Your child can choose their meal each day at the serving counter.

Thanks to the continued funding from the **Mayor of London, Sadiq Khan**, all primary school children are entitled to **Universal Free School Meals** throughout this academic year.

If you prefer, your child is welcome to bring a packed lunch. Please refer to the **Policies** section of our website for our **Healthy Packed Lunch Policy** and **Whole School Food Policy**.



Pupil Premium / Free School Meals

Universal Free School Meals (provided to all primary pupils) or **Expanded FSM** do **not** include the additional financial support listed below.

If you receive certain benefits, you may be eligible for **Pupil Premium (benefits-related Free School Meals)**. If your application is successful, your family may receive:

- Free Breakfast Club
- Discounts on selected school trips
- Reduced-cost Homework Club
- Reduced-cost Activity Clubs
