

Citizenship in Personal Development and SMSC

Please read this in conjunction with Personal Development and SMSC policies.

Aims:

- Sound knowledge and understanding of how the United Kingdom is governed, its political system and how citizens participate actively in its democratic systems of government.
- Develop a sound knowledge and understanding of the role of law and justice system in our society and how laws are shaped and enforced.
- Develop an interest in, commitment to, participation in volunteering as well as other forms of responsible activity, that they will take with them into adulthood.
- Are equipped with the skills to think critically and debate political questions, to enable them to manage their money on a day to day basis, and plan for future financial needs.

Where its covered:

- PHSE topic on Personal Finance covers all money matters.
- Duke of Edinburgh for key stage four covers volunteering and community participation.
- Enrichment gardening project covers volunteering for both key stages.
- Community Police visits and courts trip visits links to the law and justice system e.g., processes and procedures.
- School council and discussions in form time link directly to democracy as students participate in a democratic process and make decisions that effect change. Students in the lead up to local and national elections are encouraged to discuss the different political parties and what they stand for and how their policies affect the UK.
- Modern British Values are promoted throughout the school, and displays re-inforce this.
