
The Acorns School PRU 'Intervention and Alternative programme offer' to schools and LA services

This offer has been reviewed subject to requests for support from stakeholders and following an investment in staffing, resources and changing priorities.



The Acorns enhanced offer

- Dual roll procedures apply in most cases unless there is agreement for single roll from Local Authorities. Offer based on collaborative review process which Acorns will lead and mainstream schools will be expected to participate.
- If a mainstream school seeks long term intervention in years 10 and 11 and this is agreed between all parties, <u>The Acorns School will</u> <u>commit to retaining that pupil</u>. This will also be on a dual roll basis in line with DfE protocols.
- Where schools require support for assessment for an EHCP, The Acorns School will take the lead and host schools will support the process. A consultation with an Educational Psychologist or Assistant Psychologist will be available. If a pupil has an EHCP, the annual review will be included in the agreed daily rate.
- Intervention pupils who would benefit from days offsite at Vocational Provision may be accommodated by prior agreement. The additional costs of this provision will be charged to the mainstream school. The Acorns School will manage the contract with the vocational provider and will carry out all quality assurance checks to Ofsted/LCC agreed standards.
- Pupil transport will be provided for all intervention pupils who live more than 3 miles from the school. If the pupil lives within West Lancashire, pupil transport costs are included within the daily rate. If a pupil lives outside of West Lancashire, pupil transport costs will be charged back to the mainstream school in addition to the agreed daily rate.
- Where pupils require support with Team Around the School, safeguarding referrals, attendance at multi-agency meetings, core groups, child protection conferences or PEP meetings, this will be included in the agreed daily rate.
- Each pupil will require a 6-weekly review, which mainstream schools will be expected to attend. If a pupil is deemed ready for reintegration back to mainstream, a named member of the Pupil Support Team will be available to support the reintegration.
