WHOLE SCHOOL PRIORITIES

 - there is a consistency of approach across all classes
 - assessment information is used more precisely to meet children's learning needs and to challenge them sufficiently
 - there are suitably high expectations of what children are capable of and they are well prepared, ready to start Year 1
- 'Improve behaviour in the classroom' (OFSTED 2017) so that it contributes to and enhances pupil attainment and progress.
- Ensure that the school is a safe, welcoming environment, conducive to good teaching and learning

- Children will also be taught Computing, Music and PSHE throughout the year but not necessarily weekly.

HOME LEARNING

READING BOOKS & READING RECORD – Children all have a reading record which will be taken home daily. If you could find the time to listen to your child read for at least 5 minutes per day then please log it in your child's reading record. Books will be changed once they have been read, children will be expected to place their reading book and record in the tray to be changed once read.
