Reading Skills

- Use commas to determine intonation and expression when reading aloud
- Demonstrate understanding by using a range of active reading strategies, including drama, and capture thoughts in writing
- Orally summarise the main ideas drawn from more than one paragraph in a fiction text and identify key details which support this by text marking and annotation
- Create responses to the text using the PEE prompt (Point + Evidence +Explanation)
- Make active contributions to discussions about non-fiction, expressing opinions and preferences, and giving reasons
- Prepare and deliver a short oral presentation linked to fiction
- Following a presentation linked to reading, ask and answer relevant questions to deepen understanding and generate further discussion

Grammar Skills

- Demarcate complex sentences using commas in order to clarify meaning, including those which have relative clauses
- Identify and use commas to indicate parenthesis

Writing Skills

- Examine how authors develop settings in books
- Select appropriate structure, vocabulary and grammar to describe setting
- During composition, use different sentence structures. Orally compose alternatives and select from these according to effect created
- Proofread and suggest changes to grammar, vocabulary and punctuation to enhance effects and clarify meaning
