Vocabulary

PENTECOST – The celebration of the day the Holy Spirit descended on the Apostles. **CHARITY** – An organisation which collects goods or money to give to those in need.

HOLY SPIRIT – The spirit of God, part of the Holy Trinity with God the Father and God the Son.

MISSION – A set of tasks that fulfils a purpose or duty.

JOB – a role someone completes and is paid for.

TALENT – A marked ability or skill.

DIFFERENT – Not being the same.

GIFT – A natural ability.

ABILITY – Being able to do something.

HIERARCHY – A system or organisation in which people are ranked based on status or authority.
