

# Fiction - Amazing Animals - Lesson 3

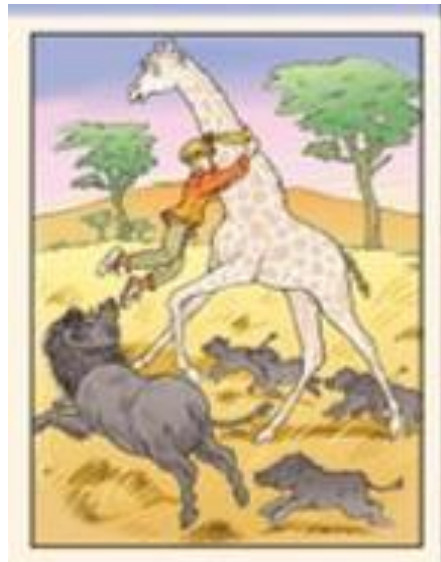
## LO – To predict what might happen to a character next
