Fronted adverbials are words/phrases at the beginning of a sentence which describe where, when or how something is happening.

Task 1: Below are some sentences from the story, 'How the camel got his hump' with an example sentence underneath each one. The fronted adverbial has been underlined. Write your own sentences using the same fronted adverbials (Don't forget the comma!)

1. Angrily, Horse, Dog and Ox decided to tell Man that the camel refused to work.

Example: Angrily, the Dog demanded some help from Camel.

2. Straight away, the Djinn rolled himself up in his dust-cloak and set off across the desert.

Example: Straight away, the Ox began to plough the field.

3. Away in the distance, the Animals observed a cloud of dust rolling across the desert.

Example: Away in the distance, a glint of light caught the attention of Camel.
