Auschwitz, Poland. In World War II, more than 11 million men, women, and children murdered in the Holocaust. It is estimated that 6 million were Jewish. Of those 6 million Jewish people killed in the Holocaust, one in six was killed at Auschwitz. It is now a museum and a place for people to pray and remember the suffering of the people to ensure that they are never forgotten.



Krakus Castle, Wawel Hill, Krakow, Poland

You must have heard about [The Wawel Castle](#). But did you know that once upon a time there was a monster that prowled the underground of the castle? Apart from the legend, there is one another token of the dragon - the Wawel Dragon Statue. It stands on the Wawel Hill, next to the Vistula River. It was designed by Bronislaw Chromy and completed in 1969. In 1972 people decided to transport it to its current location, which is at the foot of the Wawel Hill in Kraków, in front of the Wawel Dragon's den. The statue is a standing dragon that is 6 metres (20 ft) tall and, most importantly, it breathes real fire!
