How to

Bake a

Bun

Equipment:

bowl, spoon, bun tin, paper bun cases, oven

Ingredients:

100 grams self-raising flour

100 grams margarine

100 grams caster sugar

2 eggs

1 tablespoon of water

You will need, equipment list or ingredients tells the reader what they will need before they start. Usually includes quantities eg 3 sheets of paper/100g of flour

Method:

- Place all the ingredients into the bowl.
- 2 Mix the ingredients together until they turn creamy.
- 3 Place 12 bun cases in the bun tin.
- 4 Spoon the creamy mixture into the bun cases.
- 5 Place the bun tin in a hot oven for 10 to 15 minutes.
- 6 When the buns look golden brown, carefully lift them out of the oven and leave them to cool.

How to make a bird feeder ←

You will need:

- Margarine tub
- · Different coloured paper or paint
- Glue
- · Hole punch
- Wool



Method:



- First, make sure the margarine tub is empty and clean.
- Next, decorate it by sticking on pieces of brightly coloured paper. Leave it in a safe place until it is dry.



3. Use a hole punch to put four holes in the top of the margarine tub so you have two holes facing each



Carefully, thread some wool through each of the holes and tie the two ends together.



Finally, fill your bird feeder with bird food before hanging it outside.

Top-tip: Hang the feeder so you can see it through a window. Enjoy watching the birds.
