### Intent

At The Blessed Sacrament Catholic Primary School, our Spanish curriculum is a progressive curriculum which is designed to deepen and build on the previous years of learning. It's primary focus is to promote a love of foreign languages and build confidence in speaking and understanding another language. At the heart of all our learning is a focus on reading, writing, listening, and speaking skills which helps pupils to develop a genuine interest and curiosity about the culture. We want children leaving our school to have high self-esteem as well as understanding and respect for people from different lifestyles, cultures and customs.

### Implementation

Lessons are sequenced so that prior learning is considered and opportunities for revision of language and grammatical concepts are built into lessons. Through the use of Language angels, our lessons and resources help children to build on prior knowledge alongside the introduction of new skills. A series of lessons are suggested, providing structure and context as well as offering an insight into the culture of Spanish-speaking countries and communities. The introduction and revision of key vocabulary and grammatical structures is built into each lesson. This vocabulary is then included in display materials and additional resources so that children have opportunities to repeat and revise their learning.

#### Impact

At The Blessed Sacrament Catholic Primary School, we constantly assess children's work in Spanish by making formative judgements during each lesson, the children also complete an end of unit summative assessment. Using the full range of resources, including display materials, will increase the profile of languages across school. The learning environment will be consistent with key Spanish vocabulary displayed, spoken and used by all learners. We want to ensure that Spanish is loved by teachers and pupils across school, therefore encouraging them to embark on further language studies


#### **This Year's Focus**
