- that school/academy systems and users are protected from accidental or deliberate misuse that could put the security of the systems and users at risk.
- that parents and carers are aware of the importance of online safety and are involved in the education and guidance of young people with regard to their on-line behaviour.

The school will try to ensure that pupils will have good access to digital technologies to enhance their learning and will, in return, expect the pupils to agree to be responsible users. A copy of the student/pupil acceptable use agreement is available on the website, so that parents/carers will be aware of the school expectations of the young people in their care.

To respect everyone's privacy and in some cases protection, these images should not be published/made publicly available on social networking sites, nor should carers comment on any activities involving other pupils in the digital/video images.

Parents/carers are requested to sign the permission form below to allow the school to take and use images of their children and for the parents/carers to agree.

This form will be kept with your child's records until they leave The Blessed Sacrament at which point it will be destroyed in line with our retention policy. The images that are taken will be kept on the school network and not on remote devices. Images will be stored until your child leaves the school.
