## WHOLE SCHOOL PRIORITIES

  - there are suitably high expectations of what children are capable of and they are well prepared, ready to start Year 1
- 'Improve behaviour in the classroom' (OFSTED 2017) so that it contributes to and enhances pupil attainment and progress.
- Ensure that the school is a safe, welcoming environment, conducive to good teaching and learning
