<p>More events for charities.</p> <p>More charity events and more trips.</p>	<p>In the last twelve months, we have raised money for CAFOD, Save the Children, the Xavier project in Africa and Children in Need.</p> <p>I feel we do a great deal for charity and our parents are very generous.</p>
<p>More educational trips.</p> <p>More school trips.</p>	<p>School trips are very expensive with the average coach costing £150 for the day. We heavily subsidise school trips each year as many parents cannot, or do not, contribute towards the cost. Unfortunately the school budget cannot afford to pay out for more. Each class has at least one school trip out each year with some having more. However, I will discuss this with senior leaders to see what else we can do to address this</p>

<p>Headlice is a big problem.</p>	<p>You are correct but this is not something school can be expected to solve. Some parents are not fully getting rid of lice when their children have caught them. We recently posted some videos for parents to watch on our Facebook site. They are produced by a doctor and explain how this problem can be tackled by families.</p>
<p>When there are behaviour problems in class, the school could work closer with parents.</p>	<p>I am not sure if this comment refers to one particular case. I am assuming it does as, I feel working with families s one of our strengths. If there is a specific problem with one family, or one child, please approach us directly.</p>
<p>More after school activities eg discos and fayres. After school clubs for Years 1 & 2.</p>	<p>This is a tricky one. I would love to increase the amount of activities but it simply comes down to lack of volunteers to do this. It was sad that FOBS closed because there were not enough active members. For Year 1 & 2 there are activities planned for after school in the Spring and summer terms. We know they have previously missed out.</p>
<p>The school entrance from Burnside Avenue is unsightly</p>	<p>We agree but are keen not to take on responsibility for this when it is not our land and we have enough to do within our own grounds. I have previously asked the club to address this but will ask again.</p>
<p>Participation in world book day and other significant events.</p>	<p>We did take part in World Book Day this year and intend to do so next year. We also took part in Children in Need.</p>
<p>Homework was also brought up by approximately 10 parents as something they would like to see more of.</p>	<p>The homework policy is currently being reviewed and will go to Governors for approval in the Spring term. The new policy will come into effect in the summer term.</p>
<p>Text messages can sometimes be last minute</p>	<p>We are sorry if we are sometimes late in notifying parents about things going on. We do try our best but apologise that sometimes we get busy and forget. We try to publish dates well in advance through our newsletters. Usually a text will go out near the time to remind parents.</p>
<p>There are always lights left on inside school overnight.</p>	<p>Oh dear! We must sort this one out!</p>
<p>I would like to know more about how the after school club funds are used. (abbreviated message)</p>	<p>The After School club was set up approximately 12 months ago and at the point of set up, was making a significant loss. £5,000 was 'borrowed' from the school budget to subsidise the set up. The after school club only recently started to break even as numbers have only just reached the amount needed for this to happen after all out goings have been paid. When the club starts to make a profit, all the funds will be put back into resources for the children to use. Currently al resources have been bought by using the school's budget.</p>

<p>There is not much variety for non-meat eating pupils. Also, I do not feel that puddings should form part of the day time menu.</p>	<p>I will pass your comments on to our school kitchen and chef. Thank you.</p>
<p>Progress reviews are sometimes a long time apart.</p>	<p>I agree. We are looking at ways with senior leaders that progress reports can come to parents more regularly. Thank you.</p>
<p>Prams and siblings allowed at school events.</p>	<p>We have never stopped a sibling from attending a main school event. The only event they are not allowed to come to are our parent taster lunches. Siblings are welcome at all other events.</p> <p>We cannot have prams in school on open afternoons and in the mornings because there is simply not enough room in the corridors or classrooms on these days when people are moving around. This is simply a space issue. Prams are welcome at all other events eg assemblies. Parent teacher meetings, Masses.</p>

Actions following the parental questionnaire:

- Introduce new Homework Policy as planned in Summer 2017
- Introduce new after school activities for Year 1, 2, 3 & 4 through use of the sports grant
- Meeting with Senior Leaders to discuss ways we can share pupil progress with parents in between parent teacher consultation meetings.
- Meeting with senior leaders to discuss the provision of trips within the curriculum and how we can improve this.
