HRSE – CT1

We learn that we have responsibilities to ourselves, other people and creation. We think about how we can be kind and respectful to others.

HRSE – CT2

We learn more about racism including the impact it can have on those affected. We develop strategies to resist bullying / teasing and know who can help us.

Religious Education

We learn more about the Judaism and the similarities between Christianity and Judaism. We learn about key elements of the Jewish faith including the importance of the Sabbath.

HRSE – CT3

We know that we should be treated respectfully by others. We develop our understanding of vocabulary around racism.

PSHE

We learn about keeping safe online and not sharing things with people on the internet. We identify our new key adults for Year 3 and ask any questions that we may have about the transition to Key Stage Two.

Prayer and Liturgy

We hear some of the stories about Jesus as he was growing up as a Jew.

Racism

Vocabulary

RESPONSIBILITY – A duty or obligation for which someone is held accountable. **KIND** – Having a courteous, friendly, generous nature, marked by consideration for and service to others.

RESPECTFUL – Demonstrating respect for someone / something.
RACISM – Prejudice or discrimination based upon race or ethnicity.
BULLYING – Persistent acts intended to make life unpleasant for another person.
TEASING – Making fun of another person.

APOLOGISE – To express genuine respect that a certain event has happened.
JUDAISM – A religion that can trace its origin to the Hebrew people.
SABBATH – Saturday, observed in Judaism as a day of rest and worship.
EQUAL – A person or thing of equal status to others.
TRANSITION – The process of change from one state to another.

Being Kind

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HRSE – CT2 Key Knowledge 1

That things they do can hurt themselves and others. (C)

Learning Step 4 Know who they can go to for help with racism or any other issue.




