Cultural Similarities and Differences







We learn how The Church is active around the world and the different people that it serves.

Culture	The arts, customs, lifestyles, background, and habits that characterize a particular society
Cuisine	A style of preparing food, associated with a place of origin
Holy Week	The week before Easter that gives the opportunity to reflect on Jesus' sacrifice
Liturgical Year	The cycle of liturgical seasons in churches that determines when feast days, are to be observed, and which portions of Scripture are to be read
Prejudice	A preconceived opinion or feeling, whether positive or negative.
Stereotype	A conventional, formulaic, and often oversimplified or exaggerated conception, opinion, or image
