

**HOME LEARNING SUGGESTIONS YEAR X**  
**AUTUMN TERM 2 – WHY ARE RULES IMPORTANT?**



As part of our work on 'Why Are Rules Important?' you are required to complete at least 5 pieces of home learning. You can select any activities from the list below or come up with your own ideas to suggest to your teacher.

Please record any home learning on paper and we will stick it into your scrap book. The deadline for work will be Friday 6th December 2019.

<b>English</b>	Take a part from a book you really enjoy reading and turn it into a play script. Make sure you include stage direction and set it out correctly.	Read a novel that would be classed as a fantasy story. Create a themed page about the book, including details of the characters, plot and what you thought about it. You can also create a new book cover for the novel.	Find a traditional Christmas story from a different country or culture from around the world. Re-write it in your own words and create a decorated and illustrated version to display in school.
<b>Maths</b>	Create a net for a 3D shape and complete it by decorating it and sticking its sides. You could theme it to advent or Christmas or our topic work.	Do some data collection and interview as many members of your family as you can. Ask them about their favourite Christmas foods. Collect the data in a TALLY CHART and produce a BAR GRAPH to present your findings.	Learn the names of all the 2D shapes which have 3 to 10 sides. Also work out and learn what the interior angles total for each of these shapes – draw them and record the properties of each shape.
<b>Topic</b>	Use a box of some sort (shoebox?) and create an Anglo-Saxon home. Make sure the inside is set out correctly and shows what it was like to live there.	Pretend to be an Anglo-Saxon child and write a diary about a normal day in your life. What do you do during the day? What do the rest of your family get up to? What is your life like?	Design a tapestry which shows some aspects of Anglo Saxon life or an important event from the Anglo Saxon period. It can be a single image or a series of images which tell a tale. Include a border to your image.
<b>Working Together</b>	Design and build a wheeled vehicle together from waste or recycled materials – it must not have a motor. Bring it in to school and we will test them on a slope to see which can travel the furthest on 11.12.19. Prizes for the best vehicles.	Some people decorate the outside of their homes at Christmas. Draw the front of your house and create your ultimate design. Make sure you include ideas from your whole family and label who came up with each part of it.	Autumn is here and Winter is coming. When you are out and about with your family, capture some images of Autumn or Winter that you think show these seasons at their best. We will display these, judge them and the best images will win a prize on 11.12.19.
